

This table should be used by residents as a guide for which species of trees to plant in verges. Other species of trees may be used by the Shire for street tree and infrastructure landscaping if deemed appropriate.

	Eucalyptus herbertiana	Slender tree 3-8m high, multi stemmed, smooth deciduous bark turning from white to salmon pink, small cream flowers May-Oct, escarpment/rocky country.
	Murraya paniculata	Dense ever green shrub 1-5m high, white highly fragrant jasmine scented flowers Nov-Dec.
Verges without power lines or height restrictions Plus all of the above	Dillenia alata	Small tree to 10m, dense evergreen crown, colourful flaky bark, showy bright yellow flowers Oct-Jan, , fast growing, freshwater streams.
	E.confertiflora	9-12m, spreading crown, deciduous, scaly grey bark on lower trunk and smooth grey to white bark on upper trunk and branches, cream clumped flowers Sep-Nov, seasonal water logging.

	Adansonia gregorir	15m high, swollen trunk, smooth grey to brown bark, deciduous, large creamy white flowers Oct-Dec.
	Nauclea orientalis (Leichhardt pine)	Large tree 10-20m high, dense crown partly deciduous, large glossy dark green leaves, aromatic flowers and fruits, fast growing, freshwater streams
	Peltophorum pterocarpum (yellow flame tree)	Dense crowned spreading tree 10-15m high, bright yellow flowers Aug-Jan, fast growing, widely grown.
	Mimusops elengi	Large evergreen dense tree 10-15m high, bright orange fruits April-June, shiny dark green leaves, slow growing.
	Tamarindus indica	Large spreading dense evergreen tree 15-25m high, slow growing but excellent shade tree
	M.leucadendra	Large spreading tree 10-30m high, papery bark, weeping habitat, long showy cream flowers April-Sept, swamps and river banks.
	Syzygium armstrongii	Evergreen tree dense 12-20m high, showy white flowers Sep-dec, fast growing.
Public Open Space plus all of the above	E. camaldulensis	graceful 10-20m, spreading crown, smooth, white, deciduous bark, small cream flowers Aug-Nov, river banks and seasonal creeks.
