The SCP will help to shape the Shire’s goals, vision, purpose and values over the next 10 years.

The purpose of the SCP is to engage the community in planning for the future of the local government area. It involves setting priorities within the community for the future, together with a clear strategic direction.

How the Plan will be used

The Plan will influence how the Shire uses its resources to deliver services to the community.

This includes:

- Guiding Council in setting priorities and decision-making.
- Providing the basis for the design and delivery of Shire services and actions documented in the Corporate Business Plan and Annual Budget.
- Providing a rationale to pursue grants and other resources by demonstrating how specific projects align with the aspirations of our community, and within the strategic direction of the Shire.
- Informing decision-making with respect to other partners and agencies such as the State Government.
- Informing potential investors and developers of our community’s key priorities, and the way they can contribute.
- Providing a basis for monitoring progress against the community’s vision and aspirations.



The SCP has resulted in the development of three main focus areas for the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley, together with ten goals to achieve. The focus areas are:

1. Liveability
2. Connection
3. Sustainability

The goals identified have been prioritised by the community, and are things the Shire needs to achieve as part of the journey towards reaching the vision of the community.



For this to happen, the Shire has various roles to perform. These include:

Leader

Planning and providing direction through policy and practices.

For example: Taking a leadership role in unifying the community.

Provider

Providing physical infrastructure and essential services.

For example: Providing swimming pools and managing waste.

Funder

Providing funds or other resources.

For example: Providing community grants for not-for-profit community groups.

Regulator

Undertaking responsibility for the enforcement of statutory requirements.

For example: Health inspections ensuring the safe provision of food.

Advocate

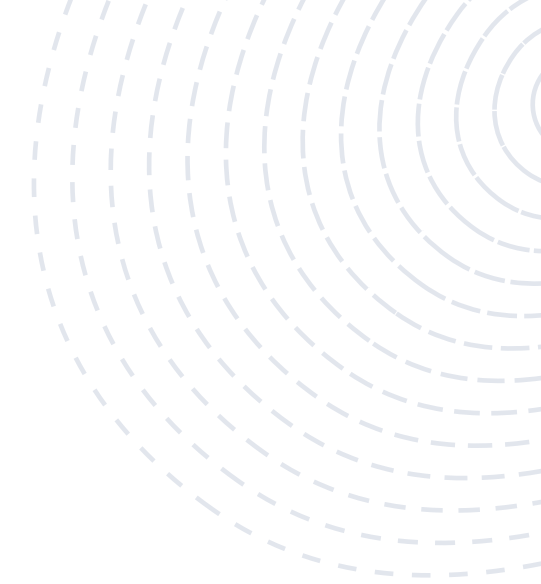
Proactively represent the community to other decision-making organisations.

Collaboration with external stakeholders to deliver services and projects.

For example: Working with other government agencies operating in the Shire.

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Partner to address all aspects of community safety, ranging from crime prevention to animal control and emergency management.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

1. The Shire will work to improve the distribution and awareness of information and resources on safety and crime prevention.
2. The Shire will design places, spaces and buildings following designing out crime principles and strategies to counter and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.
3. The Shire will advocate for greater support for families, children and young people.
4. The Shire will advocate for services to support the reduction of alcohol and drug related harm.

Goal Background

Community safety was the highest priority in the 2021 Perception Survey (Markyt Community Priorities). Some of the common themes include: the need for more police presence and visibility; the importance of addressing domestic violence and mental health; the impact of drug and alcohol abuse on crime and safety; the role of education and prevention programs in reducing violence and antisocial behaviour; and the value of community engagement and collaboration in creating a safer environment.

Community safety is a complex issue that involves both objective and subjective factors. The Shire is committed to improving community safety by implementing a range of initiatives that address both the causes and the effects of crime and disorder. These include managing risks and threats, improving and expanding public spaces and facilities, communicating and educating the public about safety issues and measures, and fostering a sense of belonging and trust among community members.

2 Healthy communities

Goal: Encouraging active, healthy lifestyles

Goal Outcomes

2.1 Access to healthcare Improve access to quality health and community services

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Ensure that facilities and services are in place to make engaging in healthy behaviours the easy option.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

1. The Shire will work with key partners to advocate for improved health and wellbeing services.
2. The Shire will collaborate with a wide range of stakeholders to advocate and provide accessible facilities that support a range of sporting and recreational activities.
3. Shire will support and build the capacity of community groups and clubs through community grants programs, advice and management of Shire reserves and facilities.

Goal Background

Health is one of the most valuable aspects of a person’s life, enabling active participation in social activities and the labour market. Local governments provide a variety of services to support the health and wellbeing of local communities, including recreational facilities that inspire connection and belonging.

Community comments outside of direct access to healthcare services link closely with the Act Belong Commit campaign. This state-wide mental health promotion campaign by Mentally Healthy WA helps to encourage people to improve and protect their mental health and wellbeing. The Shire supports this initiative through the provision of sport and recreational facilities and supporting a range of local community groups and clubs.

3 Access to housing

Goal: There are housing opportunities for everyone

Goal Outcomes

3.1 Housing Supply
The supply of housing meets current and future demand
3.2 Housing Design
Homes are designed for current and future climates, cultures, ages, incomes and circumstances
3.3 Access and housing affordability
The local community has the knowledge and skills to access affordable housing

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Advocate and partner to address inadequacies in respect to the availability, accessibility and suitability of housing.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

1. The Shire will work with key partners to advocate for the construction of housing that meets current and future demand.
2. The Shire will advocate for housing that is designed for our climate and considers the needs of those living in them.
3. Support and promote understanding of the housing market by the community, such as how to access the rental market and the steps to buying a house.

Goal Background

Housing is essential to meet basic needs, giving people a place to feel safe, enjoy personal space and raise a family.

Kununurra is suffering from housing stress. Rents have soared, rental housing available is almost non-existent, and some critical sectors of the community (e.g. childcare and tourism) are experiencing staff shortages and a reduction in service delivery. The major part of this is driven by a lack of affordable housing for workers, which is having a detrimental effect on the regional economy.

Under normal circumstances, the private sector would be expected to address such housing communities. However, in a remote community like the East Kimberley, construction costs outweigh the sales cost of new homes. This means the market is unlikely to resolve housing availability issues anytime soon.

4 Access to education

Goal: Education and training opportunities for everyone

Goal Outcomes

4.1 Childcare and preschool programs
Increase participation in early childhood educational development including quality childcare
4.2 Inclusive education pathways
Residents can access a broad range of educational opportunities, including alternative education pathways

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Advocate for education and training opportunities to meet market demand and help people to better cope with social and economic challenges

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

1. The Shire will work with key partners to ensure adequate childhood educational development places for all children in the Shire.
2. The Shire will work with key partners to advocate for a broader range of inclusive educational opportunities.

Goal Background

Education creates opportunities for development and helps people to better cope with social and economic changes. Providing education and training opportunities within the Shire helps to attract people to live and work in the region.

Research shows that children who participate in quality preschool programs are more likely to arrive at school equipped with the social, cognitive and emotional skills needed to continue learning. These benefits extend well beyond primary school, including higher levels of educational success, employment and social skills in future.

A 'traditional pathway' usually represents a linear progression through the education system, from pre-school to primary, secondary and potentially beyond. Many people in our community struggle to follow a traditional pathway, with studies showing that alternative pathways (non-linear approaches) can be of assistance in these cases.

5 Access to employment

Goal: Inspiring meaningful growth and prosperity

Goal Outcomes

5.1 Attract businesses that create local employment

The Shire is business friendly and the Shire of choice for inward investment in the Kimberley

5.2 Residents actively participate in the local economy

All residents who want to participate in the workforce and undertake business ventures

Shire role - What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Create the conditions to attract investment and businesses that generate employment and benefit the community.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

1. The Shire will promote the East Kimberley to attract investment and businesses to our Shire and support the retention and growth of local businesses that create local employment.
2. The Shire will support greater participation of local residents in the workforce and to undertake business ventures.

Goal Background

Income and jobs allow people to cover their basic needs, fulfil personal wishes and accumulate wealth, helping them to be more resistant in times of economic crisis.

The more jobs available, the more likely people are to gain employment. Attracting investment and economic growth increases the number of jobs within the local economy, creating ongoing opportunities.

Greater participation of residents in the workforce also helps to reduce welfare dependence and associated social issues in the Shire, such as alcoholism, domestic violence and others.

Strategic projects

East Kimberley Regional Airport (EKRA)

The EKRA is an important transport link for residents of the East Kimberley region providing connections to family and friends. Upgrades will increase capacity and provide opportunity for airlines to offer the community cheaper flights, more destinations and greater frequency.

Arts and Culture Strategy

Develop and implement an Arts and Culture Strategy that supports and promotes arts and culture in the community and aims to enhance social cohesion. The strategy will identify the role of the Shire and its partners in delivering arts and culture.

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Ensure places are connected by safe, accessible and well-maintained roads, footpaths, cycle ways and trails.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

- 1. Increase the use of active transport with improved paths, cycleways and end-of-trip facilities and improve road safety and connectivity.
- 2. Plan and deliver vibrant, attractive town centres that support services for residents and visitors.

Goal Background

Mobility is necessary for work and leisure activities. For many people, a good transportation network is important to satisfy needs such as shopping, education and recreation. The community would like to see places in the towns connected by well-maintained infrastructure to allow travel by foot, bicycle, car and the future option of buses.

Creating attractive and resilient town centres requires the activation of public spaces by transforming them in ways people relate best to; through collaboration with the community to develop placemaking initiatives and engaging activities in public places that improve the quality of life for residents and the experience of visitors. This would include public art, landscaping, lighting, seating, play features, pedestrian pathways, alfresco dining and events.

The community wants to see the towns look attractive and welcoming for residents and visitors. They would like to see improvements to streetscapes and promote greater vibrancy and activity within town centres, particularly through a mix of commercial and residential development. The community have reported that this impacts on tourism spending in towns and affects liveability. The community wants to see significant investment and improvements to the appearance of their town centres as has happened in other Kimberley towns in recent years.

7 Connecting to the world

Goal: Creating access and turning our remoteness into a positive experience

Goal Outcomes

- 7.1 Transport connections
People and goods are able to move freely in and out of the East Kimberley
- 7.2 Communications connections
Everyone in the Shire has access to high-speed, resilient and secure internet access

Shire role – What the Shire will do in achieving the goal

Advocate for, and develop, improved transport and communications links to the East Kimberley to keep residents and visitors well connected.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

- 1. Advocate for the planning and funding of future transport infrastructure connecting to East Kimberley.
- 2. Advocate for investment in telecommunication infrastructure in the East Kimberley.

Goal Background

Transport and communication in and out of the East Kimberley is essential for our community because they enable access to markets, employment, education, health care, social services and cultural activities. They also facilitate the exchange of information, knowledge and innovation, which are vital for competitiveness and resilience. However, providing adequate transport and communication infrastructure and services in remote and sparsely populated areas is often difficult and costly. A lack of sufficient demand often deters private-sector investment. Where commercial enterprise struggles, governments often need to step in either through public service provision or subsidies.

However, intervention is not without challenges. It requires careful planning, coordination and evaluation to ensure that the community transport and communication needs and preferences are met in an efficient, effective and sustainable manner. It involves a complex interplay of actors and institutions at different levels of government and across the private sector. Therefore, addressing connectivity in and out of the East Kimberley requires a holistic and integrated approach that considers the specific characteristics and dynamics of our region.

Partner with community groups to bring our culturally diverse community together, creating vibrant and inclusive communities.

Shire strategies in achieving the goal

- 1. Support an increase in community participation in community groups and volunteering.
- 2. Strengthen relationships with Aboriginal people which foster mutual respect and support, and cultural awareness.

Goal Background

An important way in which our communities stay connected is through our community groups and clubs. These groups bring residents together and provide group members with opportunities to give and receive social support and create a sense of belonging. It is important that these groups remain active and resilient to provide opportunities for the wider community to participate and maintain a close-knit community.

Culture can mean different things to different people. It is a way of life, encapsulating the shared values, attitudes and beliefs of the community which have been influenced by historical, social, environmental and economic experiences. The Shire is culturally diverse with people from many backgrounds and cultures. Around a third of the Shire’s population identifies as Aboriginal and almost another third of residents were born overseas. It is important to maintain an understanding of each other’s cultures and that we celebrate the community’s collective identity as well as an opportunity for self-expression.

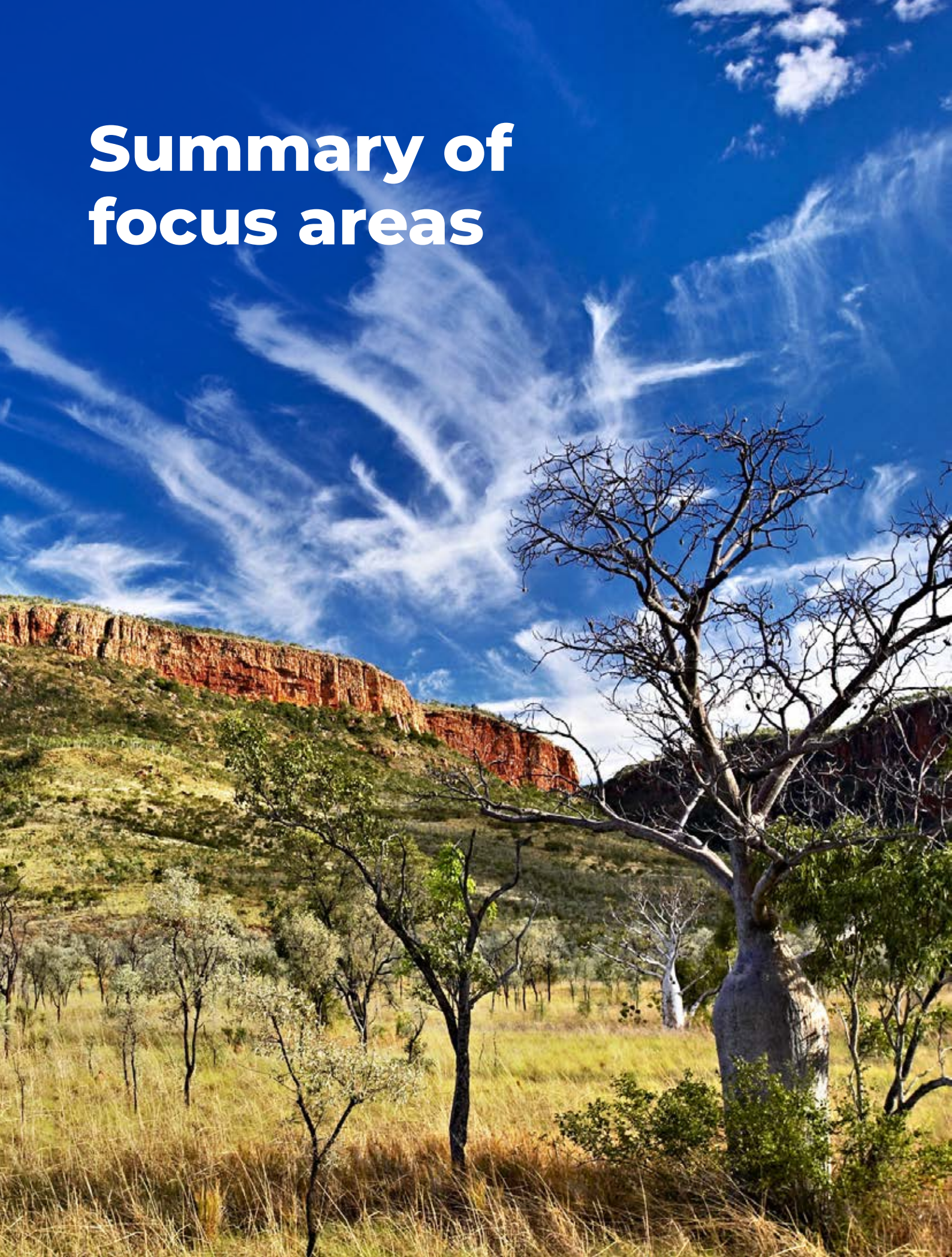
