In order to proceed with the CDO position for Kununurra the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberly will need to submit a formal letter expressing an interest to secure the position and also addressing the guidelines below which includes a 25 % contribution towards the position . Given every LG in the program has to adhere to these guidelines the SWEK will also be required to do so in order to secure the position.

**FUNDING CONTRIBUTION AND ONGOING COMMITMENT**

A key component of the CDO Scheme is the partnership between DSR and the LG. Therefore, a mandatory cash contribution is required from LG(s):

- For a collective population equal to or greater than 25,000 a cash contribution of 50% of the DSR funding amount is required (i.e. DSR - \$50,000, LG's - \$25,000)
- For a collective population less than 25,000 a cash contribution of 25% of the DSR funding amount is required (i.e. DSR - \$20,000, LG - \$5,000)
- In addition, in-kind contributions will be recognised up to the value of \$5,000

CDOs funded through the Scheme are also required to attend predetermined professional development forums as identified by DSR. In the past this has equated to 4-5 days a year.

Funding through the Scheme is provided through an annual grant including a key result schedule with annual targets and achievements based on a CDO Operational Plan.
