We appreciate the opportunity to make sure there is adequate provision allocated to the Gymnastics Club for storage of equipment, as our equipment is bulky, difficult to drag around, and very expensive, and needs to be secure and easily accessed.</p> <p>Please find attached a sketch of the gymnastics equipment showing the space that we would need to be able to store it securely and be able to access it safely.</p> <p>As you are aware the current storage is very small and equipment is stacked on every square centimetre of floor space; which means that accessing the equipment is a significant OHS management issue for the club. In addition, currently the beams, air mat etc are being stored in the gymnasium as there is no room for this equipment in storage - again this is a significant issue as it may be misused by other groups, resulting in damage or injury.</p> <p>Please also note the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum ceiling height of 2700mm • Minimum Door opening of 6m x 2.4m (if beams stored side-on). Door opening can be narrower if there is a straight run into the gymnasium for the beams and we don't have to turn any corners. • Walls and ceiling to be insulated - prevent heat from perishing equipment • Any other doors on the path of travel to the Gymnasium need to be a minimum of 1.8m wide x 2.1m tall, and be able to hold the doors in the open position • Minimum total area of 54m² will allow for some future equipment purchases <p>Please don't hesitate to contact me for more information,</p>	Email

Clayton White on behalf of Department of Local government, Sport and Recreation.	18/12/2018	<p>Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley's (the Shire) concept plans for the Kununurra Leisure Centre (KLC).</p> <p>The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (the Department) has reviewed the concept plans and notes that it is difficult to provide a detailed assessment of the concept plans without an accompanying business case. The Department would recommend that the Shire undertake a detailed business case for the current redevelopment proposal. As part of the business case consideration should be given to a funding strategy and how the project could be staged if all funding is not realised.</p> <p>The Department has concerns over the amount of water space in the new design. It appears to more than double the current available water space with three different water bodies and the zero depth splash pad which is part of the State Government's \$590,000 commitment</p> <p>The Shire's decision to redevelop on the existing site is a departure from the 2015 GHD Pre-Feasibility study that recommended a new development at East Lilly Creek. Given the significant cost of that proposal and that it would be located away from the centre of town, it would appear to make sense to redevelop the KLC on the existing site.</p> <p>The Department would have advised not to go to public consultation prior to undertaking further planning as you do run the risk of setting community expectations above what can be delivered. It is noted that the Quantity Surveyors estimate states, "that this information is for budgeting purposes only and should not be used as the basis for making a financial commitment".</p> <p>The Department would like to work with the Shire to develop the planning to a level where the</p>	Stakeholder comments via email
